“D. B. Cooper: The Real Story” featuring Mr. Johnny Surles

Cooper: The Real Story**” featuring **Mr. Johnny Surles**. Did D. B. Cooper have ties to Eastern North Carolina? Find out in this fascinating program.

At 6:30 p. m., we invite everyone to login and visit with each other and guests. This is a great time to ask any genealogy questions you may have.

At 7 p.m., Mr. Surles will share with us his years of investigative research about the elusive D. B. Cooper.

Mr. Surles has had an interest in the D.B. Cooper saga for a number of years. Mr. Cooper reportedly extorted \$200,000 in ransom and was accused of hijacking an airliner in the airspace between Portland and Seattle in November of 1971 and then parachuting from the plane. Mr. Cooper disappeared and has been the subject of a nationwide manhunt ever since.
